PRESIDENT'S REPORT

GPlace

Finally we are beginning to see some action on maintenance projects – the leaking roof and the broken pavement at the east entrance to the car park. As early as the September school holidays we might see workers on the ground or on the roof! We are still having some difficulties with the lock up and re-arming of the security system. If you are the last one in the building, please lock all 4 external doors, check there is no one in the toilets, the Mt. Clear classroom or the BRMC offices BEFORE re-setting the alarm and locking the front door. U3A plan to be offering classes at GPlace, the garden and the community shed in 2016. Please keep our good working relationship with other groups using the facilities intact by looking after the tidying up the classrooms and tearoom and reporting any problems to me.

Ballarat North Community Centre

We have been informed by the City of Ballarat (CoB) that renovations will commence in the summer holiday. First the west wall, stage and storerooms will be demolished and rebuilt. Then the wooden floor in the hall will be replaced, sanded and re-finished. This major project should be completed early in February. Further renovations will be dependent on CoB funding in the 2016 budget. What can you do? Speak to your Ballarat Council member over the next few months explaining how much this project will benefit our Ballarat North Community Centre. To start this process, we have moved the U3A AGM to Ballarat North on Wednesday 28 October. The new name - BNCC – will be launched with a sign and ceremony. Add the men's choir, displays of what the three resident groups at BN can offer members, the election of officers, and a yummy afternoon tea, and this will be a historic afternoon not to be missed!

Special Happenings

The Celtic Band launched their brilliant CD at Irish Murphy's on 16 August to a standing-room only crowd of over 200 people. The Committee's confidence by supporting this project has already seen CD sales in the black! The garden group did a major weeding/planting/soil movement in early

August. Meanwhile the woodworkers reorganized the community shed so that more room for the jewellery and mosaic classes was created. Come down and have a look – and then sign up for these practical 2016 classes. John Olsen's wordsmith talents have landed grants from U3A Network Victorian and a CoB Community Impact Grant in the past month to help us establish several programs that will build digital technology skills and online communication with our members and partner organizations at Ballarat North.
