With regard to the role of President, I am grateful for and appreciative of the work done by Elena in taking over in my absence, by Committee Members and others who were able to organise the cappuccino and chat sessions. Many thanks also to Jeff Langdon, who has taken over the role of Treasurer, and to Helen Slater for the work she did in that role.

Anyway, with regard to the activities. The hiking group, led by Andrew Parker, organised a seven day hike through the sandstone mountains that flank the Elbe River in Germany. Thirteen hikers walked, climbed, slid, scrambled and squeezed their way along mountain paths and through rocks and crevices. The rewards for their efforts included admiring wonderful landscapes, learning about local customs, culture, history and geography, and being closely involved with a friendly and supportive group of U3A members.

The next activity followed shortly after the hike, with some hikers joining the group who cycled from Prague in the Czech Republic to Cuxhaven in Germany, along the Elbe Cycle Route. With hired bikes, and for two members, their own e-bikes, panniers and cheerful dispositions the group of nine experienced a range of cultures and landscapes. Similarly to the hiking group, the cycling group learned a lot about the areas through which they cycled, and about their ability to achieve goals.

In the U3A context, the activities were 'special', as are indeed other 'special' or notable activities organised by various U3A groups. Examples have included publishing books and CDs, performing, excursions, exhibitions, and listening to prominent guest speakers. Such 'special' activities complement the inherent value of being involved in U3A classes generally.

This month we reviewed, *All the Light We Cannot See*, by *Anthony Doerr*.

Set in the Second World War during the German occupation of France, it is the story of a blind French girl, a German orphan with a flair for radio technology, a German official who recognises this talent, the courage of ordinary citizens and a spectacular diamond.

This book is brilliantly constructed so the reader never loses sight of the characters as the narrative moves between time, place and circumstance, the whole beautifully held together by the miracle of wireless. The radio waves traverse the atmosphere bringing the light of communication, recognition, familiarity and connection into the lives of friends, strangers and enemies. The light we cannot see.

Inspiring, instructive, clever, sensitive and compelling, the best book many of the group have ever read. 10/10
